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## The Code of Acceptable Behaviour

The school belongs to everyone.

The one rule for all of us in school is:

### **Be Safe; Be Kind; Be Helpful**

This means:

1. We expect everyone to be kind and considerate towards each other and respect possessions.

This means aggressive, racist and generally unkind behaviour is unacceptable and personal belongings eg clothing, must be valued.

2. We expect everyone to behave in a polite manner.

This means listening carefully, following instructions, helping each other when appropriate and being sensible at all times. Words such as "please", "thank you", "sorry" and "excuse me" will be insisted on.

3. We expect everyone to move gently and quietly about school.

This means never running, pushing or shouting but being ready to help by opening and closing doors and standing back to let people pass.

4. We expect everyone to keep the school clean and tidy and care for everything in it so that it is a welcoming place we can all be proud of.

This means putting things away properly, putting litter in bins, keeping furniture clean and unmarked and taking great care of displays, particularly of other people's work.

We must remember when walking locally or out with a school group, the school's reputation depends on the way we behave.
